

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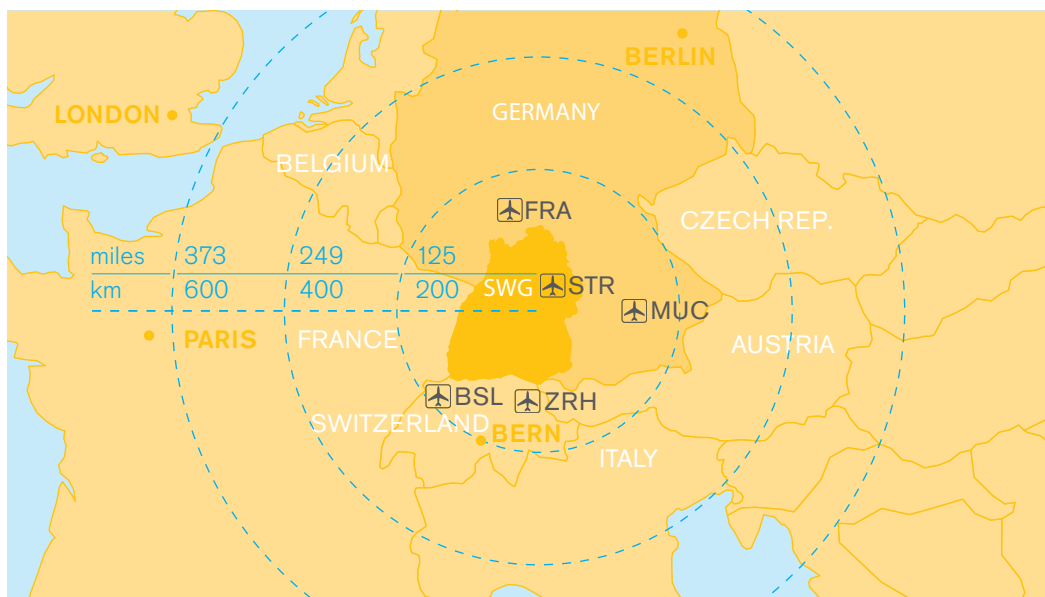

### By rail

Rail is the convenient alternative to flying and is often the quickest way of getting around Europe and SouthWest Germany. Long-distance and local trains are co-ordinated to ensure quick, easy connections. The ICE-Intercity Express high speed service offers at least one train every hour between Germany's major cities and neighbouring countries. SouthWest Germany has an excellent network of motorways (Autobahn). There are no tolls for passenger cars. Rental cars are available from locations such as airports, railway stations and hotels.



## STUTTGART AIRPORT

### Gateway to SouthWest Germany

Stuttgart Airport welcomes direct flights from around the world.

- The airport is only 8 miles (13 km) from the city center.
- The S2 and S3 urban train lines go direct to the main railway station (27 min).
- The airport is just off the A8 Karlsruhe – Munich Autobahn (highway).
- Taxis and rental car services are on-site.

## USEFUL INFORMATION

### Climate

SouthWest Germany enjoys a pleasant climate and is the sunniest state in Germany. In summer, daytime temperatures are around 77°F/25°C. Autumn is warm and pleasant and winter brings snow in the Black Forest Highlands.

### Time Zone

Germany is on Central European Time (CET). Clocks move forward an hour for summer time (March 25 to October 28).

### Currency

Germany uses the euro (€). Cash is available 24 hours a day from ATMs/cash machines. Credit cards are accepted, but expect to pay with cash in smaller shops and restaurants, and also in street markets.

### Opening times

Shops are generally open from 9 am to 6 or 8 pm. In cities and towns, most shops do not close for lunch. Although shops are closed on Sundays, bakeries are often open in the morning, while cafés/cake shops are often open in the afternoon.

Banks are generally open from 8:30 or 9 am to 4 pm, Monday to Friday; smaller branches close for lunch. Banks are closed on Saturdays and Sundays, but many have foyers with ATMs/cash machines that can be accessed 24 hours a day. Museums are generally closed on Mondays.

SouthWest Germany is renowned for its top-class restaurants and culinary specialties, such as Black Forest Cake. Throughout the region, there is a wide range of traditional and international cuisine. Vegetarian options are available on all menus.

### Language

English is widely used in the whole country.

Tour A:  
STUTT GART (P.77; 81)

Stuttgart is one of Germany's most elegant cities. Grand palaces contrast with modern architecture; attractions range from world-class art museums and ballet to parks and excellent shopping. Despite its tradition of car design and manufacture, the leafy downtown area is devoted to pedestrians.

**Arrive** at Stuttgart Airport or railway station.

**Transfer** to hotel; check-in.

**Buy a StuttCard** for discounted entry to major attractions, tours, and more.

**Explore** Stuttgart's historic city center on a guided walk or take one of Stuttgart's Hop-on Hop-off sightseeing buses that stop at all the major attractions.

**Highlights include:**

- \_ The New Palace and the Old Palace.
- \_ The Mercedes-Benz Museum, one of the world's best automobile museums.



**Take a break** in the museum restaurant.

- \_ The stylish Porsche Museum, another world-class car museum.

**Transfer** back to the city center.

- \_ Choose between two top-class art museums: the Staatsgalerie and the Kunstmuseum.

- \_ Stroll on Stuttgart's mile-long Königsstrasse, Europe's longest pedestrian shopping street.

**Dinner** in city center.

**Overnight** in Stuttgart.

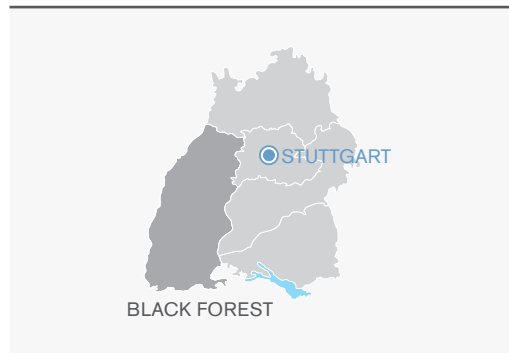
**TIP** Try local Trollinger wines in a Weinstube (tavern) in the medieval Bohnenviertel district.

Tour B:

HEIDELBERG (P. 62; 70)

Heidelberg has long been one of Europe's most romantic destinations, with its grand ruined castle, cobbled streets, ancient bridge across the Neckar River, and Germany's oldest university, founded in 1386. Not forgetting fine old taverns, small restaurants, and on the far bank – the flowery Philosopher's Path.

**Arrive** at Frankfurt Airport. **Transfer** to hotel. Drive to Heidelberg, or take the train from Frankfurt Airport train station. Check in to hotel. **Buy a HeidelbergBeWelcomeCARD** for free public transport and discounted entry to major attractions. **Explore** Heidelberg's picturesque Old Town on a guided sightseeing tour.



#### Highlights include:

- \_ The castle with views over town and river.
- \_ The castle gardens.
- \_ The world's biggest wine barrel.
- \_ The 14th-century pharmacy.

**Take a break** in a traditional tavern.

- \_ Germany's oldest university, with its 500-year-old Student Jail.
- \_ The 200-year-old Old Bridge, with its nine arches and medieval gateway.
- \_ Walk the Philosopher's Path.
- \_ Go shopping on Heidelberg's pedestrian-only Hauptstrasse (main street).

**Dinner** in city center or overlooking the river.

**Overnight** in Heidelberg.

**TIP** At Café Knösel, taste and buy a Student's Kiss – a praline chocolate created in 1863.

Tour C:

KONSTANZ (P. 52; 53; 56; 57)

Konstanz is the main resort town on Lake Constance (Bodensee). Framed by the Alps and surrounded by orchards and vineyards, this is Germany's Riviera: sunny, pretty, laid back. Two of Germany's most popular attractions are nearby: the islands of Mainau and Reichenau (a UNESCO World Heritage site).

**Arrive** at Zurich Airport. **Transfer** to hotel in Konstanz, either by road or train. Check in to hotel.

**Buy the Lake Constance Card** for discounted entry to major attractions, tours, and more.

**Explore** the medieval town center by a guided tour.

**Highlights include:**

\_ The SEA LIFE aquarium, with fish, penguins and more from around the world.

**Take a break** in a café overlooking the lake.

\_ The Mediterranean-like island of Mainau.

\_ Its glorious gardens and park with handsome 150-year-old trees, butterfly houses.

\_ The baroque splendor of the palace.



\_ **Take a cruise** on the lake by boat from Konstanz harbor.

\_ Take the ferry to charming Meersburg with its 800-year-old castle.

\_ Take the ferry to Friedrichshafen, birthplace of the airship, with its Zeppelin Museum.

**Return** to Konstanz. **Dinner** in city center.

**Overnight** in Konstanz.

**TIP** In Konstanz, relax with a glass of local wine or beer at the Staader Fährhaus, overlooking the yachts in the marina.

## Tour D: HEIDELBERG – BADEN-BADEN – STUTTGART

The old city of **Heidelberg** on the Neckar River, is dominated by its ruined castle. **Baden-Baden** has long been famous for its natural mineral spas and its stylish casino, parks and shops. **Stuttgart** mixes ancient and modern with palaces and parks, car museums and modern art galleries.

**Arrive** at Frankfurt Airport. **Transfer** to Heidelberg by road or by train direct from Frankfurt Airport; check in to hotel.

**Buy a HeidelbergBeWelcomeCARD** for public transport, discounted entry to attractions. Explore Heidelberg's picturesque Old Town on a guided tour. **Highlights include:**

- \_ Germany's oldest university and Student Jail.
- \_ Pedestrian-only Hauptstrasse (main street).

- \_ The castle, world's biggest wine barrel.

**Dinner** in city center or overlooking the river.

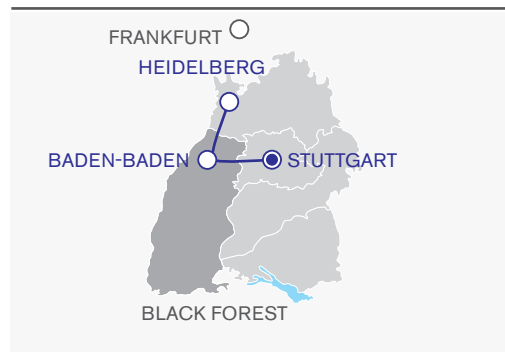

Sunny Freiburg is a world-leader in green energy; the traffic-free downtown is full of cyclists, walkers, and sidewalk cafés.

**DAY 3: FREIBURG (P. 26; 43)**

**Explore** the traffic-free old heart of the 'Capital of the Black Forest' on foot.

**Highlights include:**

- \_ The spectacular Minster, 14th-century cathedral
- \_ Augustinermuseum with its great art collection.
- \_ The Bächle, little streams along the streets.

**Take a break** at a café; taste Black Forest Cake.

\_ Germany's longest cable car to the Schauinsland summit (4,000 ft/1,219 m).

**Dinner** in city center. **Overnight** in Freiburg.

## MANNHEIM – STUTTGART – ULM

Three cities offer three contrasting experiences. The birthplace of the car 125 years ago, **Mannheim** has a fine museum, excellent shopping and an elegant park. In **Stuttgart**, enjoy historic palaces, art galleries, world-class car museums and a vibrant cultural scene. **Ulm** surprises with its Gothic cathedral, medieval Fishermen's Quarter (fun shops, cafés), and contemporary art museums.

### DAY 1: MANNHEIM (P. 65; 71)

**Arrive** at Frankfurt Airport. **Transfer** to Mannheim by road or by train direct from Frankfurt Airport; check in to hotel.

**Explore** SouthWest Germany's second largest city on a guided walking tour.

**Buy a MannheimCard**; gives discounted entry to major attractions, tours.

#### Main attractions include:

- \_ The TECHNOSEUM with early cars, bicycles.
- Take a break** by the Art Nouveau Water Tower.
- \_ The four different Reiss-Engelhorn Museums.

**Return** to the city center.

- \_ Shop on the broad, pedestrianized Plancken.

**Dinner** in city center. **Overnight** in Mannheim.

TIP **Relax in the Luisenpark botanical gardens.**

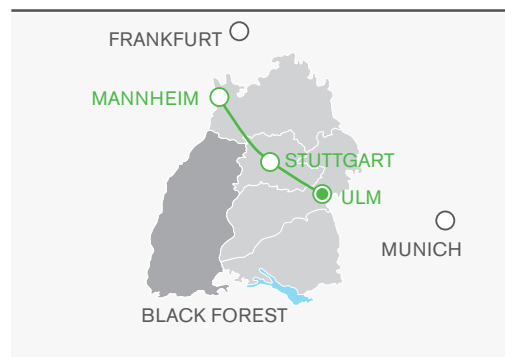

## KONSTANZ – FREIBURG – BADEN-BADEN

This tour is all about relaxation – by Lake Constance, in the Black Forest, and at Europe’s most fashionable spa destination. With history and lakeside gardens, **Konstanz** enjoys a stunning landscape, with cruises on the lake. Close to the French border, **Freiburg** has a real joie de vivre with medieval houses, great food and wine, and a superb cathedral. As well as **Baden-Baden’s** hot natural mineral springs, this elegant resort boasts the world’s most beautiful casino.

### DAY 1: KONSTANZ (P. 52; 53; 56; 57)

**Arrive** at Zurich Airport. **Transfer** to hotel in Konstanz, either by road or train. Check in to hotel.

**Buy the Lake Constance Card** for discounted entry to major attractions, cruises.

**Explore** the medieval town center by guided tour.

**Take a break** at a café overlooking the lake.

#### Other highlights include:

Linking together some 90 castles and palaces between Mannheim and Prague, the Castle Road (Burgenstraße) is one of the most famous driving routes in Germany. Along the way are some of the world's most popular destinations: Heidelberg Castle, the medieval town of Rothenburg ob der Tauber and Nürnberg's Kaiserburg. Welcome to the world of pigs, pork and folklore: Stuttgart's Pig Museum (SchweineMuseum). Rated the biggest of its kind in the world, according to Guinness World Records, this unique museum opened in 2010. As well as tracing the story of the pig from farm to plate, there are 45,000 pig-related exhibits. Think art, kitsch, and culture; postage stamps and postcards, good luck charms and, of course, piggy banks. There is also a large beer garden, and a restaurant overlooking the porcine sculpture garden.



High in the forest to the west of Stuttgart, Solitude Palace (Schloss Solitude) has glorious views over the surrounding countryside. Now used as an international academy for artists, the palace can still be visited, but only as part of one of the special guided tours.
