The basilica, which was consecrated in the 11th century, was one of the largest Romanesque churches in Germany. The original monastery buildings and the cloister were replaced by buildings in Gothic style. Even today, the former monastery complex of St. Peter and Paul and the lovingly restored Aurelius Church are known far beyond the region of Calw.

Monastery Museum

The museum building, which was added to the north side of Aurelius Church in the Romanesque period is an important testimony of monastery history. Interesting facts about how monks lived in a Benedictine monastery and about the history of the resort Hirsau: numerous texts, images and archaeological finds provide insight into the Hirsau monastic culture, which dates back more than 1,100 years.

Enjoy the Moment – the "AugenBlick" Tours

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
Location.

A charming little town in central location

Situated about 50 km south-west of the Baden-Wuerttemberg state capital Stuttgart and 30 km south of the "Golden City" of Pforzheim, Calw is the gateway to the Central/ Northern Black Forest Nature Park.

From the town centre to the woods on foot

The historic old town and the town districts to the west are surrounded by extensive dark green coniferous forests. A "green belt" encompasses Calw — the municipal forest starts directly behind the picturesque market place.





Topography

The district-offiliated town of Calw with its 13 town districts and more than 23,000 inhabitants lies right in the heart of Baden-Wuerttemberg. With a surface area of about 60 km² it is the largest town in the District of Calw.

Particularly charming

To the east it adjoins the region known as the "Heckengäu". This unspoilt rural landscape is characterised by extensive meadow orchards and blackthorn and juniper heathland — it offers infinite opportunities for exploring.

Calw – Town by the river

Nestled in the valley of the river Nagold and its surrounding hillsides, Calw is located in the middle of the Northern Black Forest adventure region. The river Nagold forms a natural border between the native landscape of the Northern Black Forest in the south west and the "Heckengäu" to the north east.

Timber-Framed Town.



Architecture

Strolling across the market place and through the winding alleys of the town you appreciate the beauty of the medieval town. You encounter the many facets of timber framing in more than 200 buildings from the late 17th century: almost the entire town centre is under cultural heritage management.

History of the town

The origins of the town date back to the 11th century. However, the first traces of human settlements go back to approx. 8,000 BC. In the Middle Ages, Calw was an important trading town, based particularly on its trade in textiles and leather. In the 18th century, timber rafting caused Calw's economy to flourish. In the 1970s, Calw was awarded the status of district-affiliated town.



Sightseeing

Calw offers informative and fascinating museums as well as public and private guided tours, themed walks on culture, architecture and nature topics. Insight into the historic traditional crafts of the town, guided tours for children and much more — Calw will impress you with its tremendous variety.

The German Half-Timbered House Road

Calw is one of 30 towns along the Southern German section of the German Half-timbered House Road. The sign-posted historical walk through the winding alleys of the town past impressive half-timbered buildings conveys an impression of what the medieval town may have looked like. Town Districts.

Hirsau – Health resort with a famous monastery

In unspoilt nature, in one of the most appealing spots in the Nagold valley you can take a deep breath and relax. The health resort in the midst of the Northern Black Forest invites you to unwind. To revive body and soul just next door to the Hesse town of Calw.

Tip: Monastery atmosphere and historical heritage all in one!

Tip: Directly opposite the monastery complex



of St. Peter and Paul there is a three-and-a-half hectare red-deer enclosure with up to 12 animals and three or four offspring each year. You can learn more about the deer family from the information panels at the feeding station.

Stammheim

Stammheim is one of the oldest places in the district with its own special highlights. From 1843 until 1957 the Lower Mill served as a flour mill. With a diameter of 11.5 metres, the mill wheel, which was replaced in 1998, is Europe's largest wooden overshot water wheel. One of the most beautiful and well-preserved ruins in the area is the Waldeck castle ruin. Built around 1100, it served as a fortified castle, which was feared throughout the land in the times when rule of force held sway. Today the site is a popular hiking destination in the Northern Black Forest.





Altburg

What was everyday life like in the 19th century? The Farmhouse Museum located in a building that was erected in 1813 provides a comprehensive impression of a 19th century rural dwelling with its stable and barn.

Tip: The "Bohnenberger history trail"

guides you through idyllic Altburg. On 22 information panels you learn interesting facts about the history of Altburg and the work of two ingenious inventors: the Bohnenbergers.

Holzbronn

Holzbronn, with its village character, is situated on a plateau in the "Heckengöu". Built in 1908, the Protestant church of St. Bernhard with its distinctive church spire is the landmark of Calw's smallest town district.

Tip: "Xanderklinge" tour

The adventure trail along the "Xanderklinge". Enjoy breath-taking views down the gorge, a waterfall over three metres high and ten-metre high cliffs.





Hermann Hesse.

Herrmann Hesse, who was born in Calw in 1877, spent his childhood and youth in Calw.

The town left its mark on Hesse, who won the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1946. He once wrote: "Wherever you spent your childhood, that is home" Today, many buildings remind you of the settings described in his writings. Strolling through the steep and narrow alleys you can immerse yourself in the times of the most widely read German author of the 20th century.

Hermann Hesse Museum

Please note: The Hermann Hesse Museum is closed until 2025, due to renovation and reconstruction.

Alternatively, it is possible to visit the new presentation about Hermann Hesse in the Palais Vischer, which provides an overview about the life stages of the poet and his work as a painter in his adopted home Montagnola. In addition,

two rooms deal intensively with the theme of the "Steppenwolf" novel. In the Tannery

Museum (front-building) exists also a Hermann Hesse exhibition, where the main topics are about "Hermann Hesse's Childhood in Calw" and "Calw in Hermann Hesse's work".

Stock up on new ideas in the Hermann Hesse Garden along the Hagbrunnen stream: this oasis of peace is just the right place to disengage and recharge your batteries. In the reading garden behind the library you can relax by the water — just as Hermann Hesse liked to do.

Gerbersau Summer Readings

Every year, between Hesse's birthday on 2 July and the date of his death on 9 August, special events and lectures are held in his commemoration. Hesse's hometown Calw is the setting for these stories and texts. Literary walks in the footsteps of the writer on Sundays complement the cultural offer.

Nikolaus Bridge

Nikolaus bridge is Calw's distinctive landmark and Hermann Hesse's favourite place, where he used to fish. The Gothic chapel was built around 1400 and dedicated to St. Nikolaus, the patron saint who provided protection against high and stormy water. Until 100 years ago, you could watch the rafters from the stone bridge in their strenuous activity: rafts made up of approx. 100 logs and about 150 to 200 metres long had to be manoeuvred through this bottleneck.

Aurelius Boys' Choir

Since it was founded in 1983, the Aurelius Boys' Choir has developed into one of the most renowned boys' choirs in Germany. Its musical work focuses on sacred and secular choir music. Both the choir and its boy soloists are outstandingly successful at national and international opera houses and travel the world as musical ambassadors for the town of Calw.

Music school

Making music in one of the most beautiful half-timbered houses of the town. Musically, the Calw Music School is highly committed to tradition. The dedicated teaching staff provides creative instrument and singing classes from classic to pop music. More than 2,000 students of all ages live for music and transport it far beyond the boundaries of the town.
