

KEY DATES IN FREIBURG'S HISTORY



Discover Freiburg step by step!

Freiburg's Old Town offers plenty of tourist attractions, narrow little streets, historical buildings and lively squares – Join us on a discovery tour through 900 years of history of a city that is still modern and young. You can either follow our route or head off towards whatever takes your fancy.

We start in the middle of the city on the Rathausplatz (Town Hall Square). The **Alte Rathaus** (Old Town Hall) **11** with its red façade and Tourist Information office offers a point of contact for your questions and requests. Just next door is the **Neue Rathaus** (New Town Hall) **11** which served as a lecture hall for the University of Freiburg until the end of the 19th century. Where Freiburg's municipal leaders now meet was once a place of anatomy and polyclinics. Directly across you find the **Martinskirche** (St. Martin's Church) **32**. It was built around 1300 and was a monastic church of the nearby Franciscan monastery until 1783.

There's a special legend surrounding the monk Berthold Schwarz. As an alchemist, it is said that he invented gunpowder by accident. At the foot of his fountain statue in the middle of the Rathausplatz (Town Hall Square), the coat of arms of Freiburg and its twin cities shine as elaborate mosaics. Many such works made from colourful stones decorate Freiburg's Old Town and the entrances to many shops at the same time, so it's always worth looking down!

We stroll left past Martinskirche (St. Martin's Church) through the Franziskanerstraße to the **Haus zum Walfisch** (The Whale House) **5** with its magnificent late-Gothic doorway. Built by Emperor Maximilian's treasurer, it housed the famous humanist Erasmus of Rotterdam between 1529 and 1531. A little further on, we reach the **Basler Hof** (Regional Council) **2**, one of the most important secular buildings in the city which throughout the years has housed the headquarters of significant institutions since its construction between 1494 and 1496. Today, it is the location of the city's Regional Council. Here on the Kaiser-Joseph-Straße, called the "Große Gass" ("Large Street") in the Middle Ages, was where the city market would set up. Today, the "Kajó" with its arcade galleries built after the war is considered the best area in Freiburg to enjoy a stroll and some shopping.

Passing the **Basler Hof** (Regional Council) on our right, we see the heart of Freiburg, the **Münsterplatz** (Cathedral Square). From Monday to Saturday – farmers and merchants sell their goods at the **Cathedral Market**. Try a long red sausage, the "Lange Rote", drink a glass of wine or enjoy one of the other specialities on offer. In the middle of the square is the imposing **Freiburger Münster** (Cathedral) **33** with its 116 m-high tower. Built between 1200 and 1513, it has survived multiple wars almost unscathed and features captivating sights such as the magnificent pediment in the vestibule, historic stained glass windows and the high altar painted by Hans Baldung Grien.

On the south side of the cathedral, the red façade of the **Historisches Kaufhaus** (Historical Merchants' Hall) **6** really stands out. Decorated with Habsburg sculptures and coats of arms, it was built between 1520 and 1532 to manage the markets in the city and served as a customs, trade and financial building. Right next to it you will see the **Erzbischöfliche Palais** (Archiepiscopal Palace) with its richly decorated

balcony, once the palace of estates for the Breisgau knights. Further east on the square, the **Wentzingerhaus** (Museum of Municipal History) **23** was built in 1761 by painter, architect and sculptor Johann Christian Wentzinger as his "residence on the beautiful corner". Today it is home to the **Museum für Stadtgeschichte** (Museum of Municipal History). The "Haus der Badischen Weine" (House of Baden Wines) is a must for all wine lovers. Here, you can sample a number of wines from Freiburg and the region.

Continue past the **Alte Münsterbauhütte** (Old Cathedral Workshop) to the **Herrenstraße**, where you will find the **Erzbischöflichen Ordinariat** (Archiepiscopal Ordinariate) **3**, an outstanding example of late historicism in Baden. After passing through the narrow **Münzgasse**, we arrive at one of the most beautiful streets in Freiburg, the **Konkordienstraße**. It was a lively street full of artisans in the Middle Ages and remains so until today. Its charming façades and little boutiques make it an ideal place to

wander around. We leisurely stroll on and reach the **Schwabentor** (Swabian Gate) **12**. Built in the middle of the 13th century, it is the younger of the two remaining gates. Its façade tells the legend of the Swabian who once tried in vain to buy the city. Around the Schwabentor (Swabian Gate), there are a number of restaurants offering Baden specialities. Germany's oldest inn "**Zum Roten Bären**" **15** is especially interesting. From here, it's worth taking a detour to the countryside, just five minutes away! We cross the Schwabentorsteig bridge and walk up to **Schlossberg** **16** and take in the magnificent view of Freiburg.

Freiburg's Obere Altstadt (Upper Old Town) with the **Gewerbekanal**, **Gerberau** and **Fischerau** alleys and the "island" is worth every step you take over the cobblestone pavements! This idyllic quarter is also known as "Klein Venedig" ("Little Venice") and is the ideal place for visiting galleries, wandering around family-owned shops, spending time in one of the cosy cafés or watching the crocodile in the canal. Following the **Gewerbekanal**, we arrive at the busy **Augustinergasse** (Augustine Street) with the former monastery of the Augustinian hermits. Built in 1300 and reconstructed in baroque style at the start of the 18th century, it houses what is arguably Freiburg's most beautiful museum, the **Augustinermuseum** **18**. The Obere Altstadt (Upper Old Town) was once Freiburg's artisanal quarter during the Middle Ages.

Today, you can take in the almost Mediterranean charm of the city, cool off your feet in the little canals and simply watch the world go by. Feeling relaxed and refreshed, we reach the city's oldest intact watchtower, **Martinstor** (Martin's Gate) **7**. Used as a prison for a while / some time, it was raised by a level and restored at the start of the 20th century.

We continue past **Bertoldsbrunnen** (Bertold's Fountain), the crossing point for the urban tramways, and enter the **Bertoldstraße**. Here, we follow the tram lines towards the **Universität** (University) **38** and reach the **Platz der Alten Synagoge** (Old Synagogue Square). This is where traditional meets modern with the new **Universitätsbibliothek** (University Library) **36** and the historic **Stadttheater** (Municipal Theatre). Passing through the **Rotteckring**, we reach **Colombipark** and the **Colombischlössle** (Archaeological Museum). This villa was built for Countess de Zea Bermudez y Colombi between 1859 and 1861 in the English neo-gothic style. Today it is home to the **Archäologische Museum** (Archaeological Museum) **17**. On the last part of our route, as we pass the **Zunfthaus** (Guild House) **19** of the Breisgau fools (Carnival Museum) in the **Turmstraße**, we can see the city's oldest council building, the **Gerichtslaube** (Old Court House) **4**, documented as a council building since 1303, is located in the inner courtyard behind the **Alte Rathaus** (Old Town Hall), where our tour began.

LANGE ROTE

The smallest emblem in Freiburg can be found right next to the largest: the Münsterwurst sausage – also known as the “Lange Rote” or long red one – can be found in front of the cathedral at the market between Monday and Saturday. It is an essential part of any visit to Freiburg!

BÄCHLE

The “Bächle” canals run throughout the Old Town and it's impossible to imagine Freiburg without them. In former times, they provided water for putting out fires. Today, the canals are a refreshing way for young and old to cool off, but beware: legend has it that anyone who steps in will marry a Freiburg citizen!

MOSAICS


It's also worth looking down! Ever since the 19th century, the entrances to many buildings have been decorated with colourful mosaics portraying the city's coat of arms, guild/business signs or cultural motifs. It is definitely a different angle to take a photo!

PICNIC SPOTS

Just take a break. There are numerous sunny and shady spots in Freiburg where you can take a breath and enjoy the day. Benches and green areas can be found in the Stadtgarten (Municipal Park), on the Schlossberg, at the Dreisam River or Seepark and in many other parks.


